


What's Cooking?

Easy Beef Ramen Stir-Fry

Cook Time: 20min · Serves: 4



Method

1. In a large skillet over medium heat, heat oil. Add onions, peppers, and broccoli and cook until tender, 10 minutes. Add ground beef and cook until no longer pink, 5 minutes more. Drain fat.
2. Make sauce: Whisk together soy sauce, brown sugar, apple cider vinegar, Sriracha, and garlic.
3. In a medium saucepan, bring water to a boil. Add cooked ramen noodles and cook until tender, 2 minutes. Drain.
4. Add cooked ramen noodles to skillet and pour over sauce. Toss until completely combined, then garnish with green onions and serve.

Ingredients

- 1 tbsp. vegetable oil
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 1 red bell pepper, chopped
- 1/2 head broccoli, cut into florets
- 1 large carrot, cut into half moons
- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1/4 c. soy sauce
- 1 tbsp. brown sugar
- 1 tbsp. apple cider vinegar
- 2 tsp. sriracha
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 2 packets ramen noodles, seasoning packets discarded
- Sliced green onions, for garnish

Members from Main Roads, MACA, local businesses, communities, staff and station





COP'S CORNER

with Sergeant Nicholas Hamer

Just a friendly reminder to plan ahead for upcoming events.

Of late there have been a few funerals in and around the Marble Bar area which local community members have had to travel to, and other cases where persons from out of town have travelled to Marble Bar.

What people should be doing is planning ahead to make sure that their cars are road worthy and registered.

Also making sure that there is at least one person who has a current, up-to-date driver's license.

This is a requirement of law - any car on a gazetted road has to be registered and the driver licenced to drive.

We have stopped some persons of late who think

that all gravel roads are back roads which means they can drive. This is not the case - some gravel roads are gazetted roads which means a drivers licence is required.

What could end up happening is that the car could be seized and held here or another location for 28 days. Then a fee must be paid to get it out.

If you are unsure about either of these two matters come and see us and we may be able to assist you.

Additionally, every person in the car should be wearing a seat belt or for the younger persons in either a baby capsule or a booster seat.

So let's ask a question before setting off anywhere and avoid any court appearances.

Calidus has commenced a pre-feasibility study on the project and Managing Director Dave Reeves will be presenting an introduction to the project to the Marble Bar community.

Community Info Session: Marble Bar Road Realignment – Coongan Gorge Project

On Wednesday the 12th of April, the CRC hosted another information session with personnel and staff from Main Roads and MACA Civil. From Main Roads, we were joined by Project Manager Chris Raykos and management personnel and staff Ben Sims, Kobus Wessels, Ismo Murros, Remy Lavis and Louise Mawson. From MACA, Project Manager Shaun Elsdon and Mayuran Logan were also in attendance.

The session covered current progress on the Marble Bar Road Realignment - Coongan Gorge Project. Chris Raykos lead the presentation and answered questions from the audience.

Talking points included the expected project completion date, which is currently set for the beginning of June.

Mr. Raykos also highlighted their obligations after completion, including environmental rehabilitation and area cleanup.

There were also discussions about the use of


Long Pool as a water source - previously a cause of contention to the point of protest rallies. After the protests, Main Roads had removed their pump and used water sourced from nearby bores, however this had become insufficient and so a new pump was temporarily installed at some distance away from the pool. The new pump was completely sealed and so did not pose the same contamination risks as the original.

The presentation was capped off with some incredible drone footage from Kobus Wessels, which featured some blasting activity and a birds-eye view of the new road which clearly showed the amount of material that has been blasted and shifted to make way for the new highway.

To finish the night we all enjoyed a hot drink with some delicious cake supplied by Traveller's Rest. The CRC would like to thank Main Roads and MACA staff, as well as everyone who attended the night.


