

# What's Cooking?

## CHARGRILLED CHICKEN AND PINEAPPLE SALAD



Sourced from Taste

### Method

- Combine pineapple juice, sugar and soy sauce in a large bowl. Add the chicken and toss to coat. Set aside for ten minutes to develop the flavours. Thread the chicken pieces onto 4 metal skewers. Reserve the marinade.
- Heat a BBQ grill or chargrill on medium high. Cook the chicken skewers for 3-4 mins each side until golden brown and cooked through. Set aside for 5 mins to rest.
- Meanwhile, cook pineapple on grill for 2 mins each or until lightly charred.
- While the pineapple is cooking, place the reserved marinade in a small saucepan. Bring to the boil over high heat. Cook for 3 mins or until mixture thickens slightly. Set aside to cool.
- Arrange salad leaves, tomato, carrot, onion, cucumber, pineapple and chicken skewers on a large serving plate. Pour over marinade in the pan. Season.

### Ingredients

- 1/3 Cup (80ml) Pineapple juice
- 1 tablespoon Brown Sugar
- 1 tablespoon Soy Sauce
- 500g Chicken Thigh Fillets chopped
- 1 small Pineapple, peeled, thinly sliced crossways
- 200g Pkt 4 Leaf Salad
- 250g Cherry Tomatoes, halved
- 1 Carrot peeled, cut into long matchsticks
- 1 small Red Onion thinly sliced
- 1 Lebanese cucumber, halved lengthways, thinly sliced

# ATLAS IRON

# COMMUNITY UPDATE

Wander down the Hillside – Marble Bar Rd long enough and you will see signs of mining life re-emerging in an area that hasn't seen much activity since the old Comet Mine days.

Atlas Iron have recently begun construction on their Corunna Downs Project. Unlike neighbouring mine sites, Atlas Iron won't be tapping into the gold that the Marble Bar area is known for. Working across 5 open cut pits, the Corunna Downs operation will have a sole focus on the iron ore that threads through the ranges.

Atlas Iron was taken over by the Hancock Prospecting Group in late 2018, and since then has gone through a significant consolidation period. Now moving into a growth phase the company, which was struggling financially prior to takeover, has now been able to reignite its newest passion – the Corunna Downs Project.

Corunna Downs is located 33km south of Marble Bar. Nestled amongst the hills of Panorama, Eginbah and Corunna Downs Stations, the first loads of iron ore are expected to be processed early 2021. Similar to the current Mt Webber operation, Atlas Iron will use road trains to haul ore 234 kilometres to Port Hedland before loading ships bound for China. The project is expected to create 850 direct employment opportunities over a starting mine life of 5 years and produce around 5 million tonnes per year.

Currently, there are major upgrades occurring on the Hillside-Marble Rd with the majority of the road between the mine and town being sealed to cater for the road trains hauling to port.

A brand new road is being built to bypass the town that will ensure the noise impact on residents is greatly reduced. MACA Civil have been working on this section of work since April 2020 and anticipate completion by November.

The new Corunna Down's Village is currently being built by McNally Mining & Resources. All buildings are now in place, with construction coming to end soon to ensure occupancy in the last week of September.

Atlas Iron have recently awarded both the mining and crushing contracts and are expecting to see both companies complete mobilising to site in the next few months. MACA Mining will be providing mining services and Mineral Resources Limited providing crushing services. Atlas Iron has a longstanding relationship with both contractors with both providing previous and current service across its other Pilbara operations.

The camp services contract is yet to be awarded. While the camp is under construction, Atlas Iron have been grateful for the warm welcome received at Limestone Station, Travellers Rest and the Iron Clad hotel. During one particularly busy month, accommodation and dining were particularly hard to come by!

Supervisor of Stakeholder Management, Adrian Mudronja, is already a well-known face in town. Atlas Iron runs a Helping Hands grants program and have previously provided support to community groups in Port Hedland, Newman and at Yandeyarra. Locals are encouraged to reach out to Adrian for more information on this grant which is currently open for applications.

Atlas Iron welcome all enquiries on the project and will be hosting a town hall event at the Community Centre in October 2020. # LOCAL HISTORY

Too few know what our pioneers endured in our district to open up the country for future generations. This is a little part of the transport history in the 1920's. Before motorised vehicles came into the district, the people on the sheep stations, as they were then, either travelled in the two or four in hand horse drawn buggy, or made the journey on a donkey or bullock wagon to get from place to place. Some stations had a camel wagon to transport mostly larger necessary goods.

We know what harsh climate conditions the pioneers had to endure in the North and their first cars had no air conditioners or four wheel drive luxuries. The creek and river crossings had spinifex laid down in the two wheel ruts to enable them to cross. How they coped in the wet would be another story altogether, back in those days roads were just two wheel tracks.


Their version of air-conditioning was either scorching hot air in the summer or the cold winter wind blowing in and through the vehicle. Add to this the dust that would of blown in, created a custom that on arrival at a destination they were met by being handed a towel to either go to have a shower or to wash off he dirt that had mixed with any sweat.

No one travelled without carrying a hessian or canvas water bag. This was hung on the outside of the vehicle to allow the air to blow through and keep the water cool enough to drink.

The popular makes of cars at that time were the Model T Ford, the Austin Tourer, The Willys Jeep and others.

Here are some pictures of station vehicles bought in the 1920's, each was given a name.

- ✓ Call 1800 675 888 if your dog becomes ill after moving out of northern WA.



# ANIMAL WATCH:

## PILBARA OLIVE PYTHON

Did you know we have a sub species of the Olive Python here in the Pilbara? Our very own rather aptly named Pilbara Olive Python! They are nocturnal, olive green or dark brown in colour with a creamy coloured belly. They grow up to four meters long and feast on wallabies, quolls and spinifex pigeons to name a few. They like to lie in wait for their prey and ambush it as it wanders past! Olive pythons differ from most pythons in that their skin is smooth due to their scale pattern.

Researchers think the Pilbara Olive Python is quite rare but due to their vast habitat it is a bit



hard to know that for certain. They have managed to tag some snakes and through this have been able to learn a bit about them. In Millstream National Park, every two to three years, the pythons congregate on the cliff faces to mate. This goes on for a few months while they enjoy the river views then the female retreats to lay her eggs. She incubates them by coiling herself around them and shivers if necessary to maintain a constant temperature. They lay up to a dozen eggs and incubate them for about two months.

Their numbers may be in decline due to their low reproduction rates, mining activities, wildfire and also because some of their food sources are becoming more scarce. Also they look a bit like a King Brown snake and for this reason people tend to kill them. If you see the Pilbara Olive Python crossing the road at night don't speed up to run it over - in fact don't kill any snake that is doing you no harm, let them go about their business and consider yourself lucky to have spotted one!

## APPROACHING MARRIAGE

- September 19th 1940 -

The marriage of Miss Dorothy Mary Bowen, of Manjimup and Mr James Ironside of Marble Bar, will be solemnised at St Mathew's Church Port Hedland, on Friday September 20.

## FIRE AT MARBLE BAR HOTEL LEAVES GUESTS WITH ONLY THEIR EVENING DRES

- September 13th 1949 -

While a race week ball was going on in Marble Bar last night the residential section of the Ironclad Hotel was burnt to the ground. As a result, many visitors for the week's festivities will have to go home clad in evening gowns and suits.

Dancers rushed from the ball when the alarm was given, but despite their efforts the building was gutted within 15 minutes. The adjoining building was also gutted.

G.W. Miles store caught fire, but firefighters climbed through the ceiling and managed to smash the burning section away. There were about 24 guests staying at the Ironclad Hotel. Permanent boarders suffered heavy personal losses. The hotel was the only residential building in the town and the accommodation problem will now be acute.

Last night's was the second fire in the district within a few days. On Friday a valuable shearing shed at Corunna Station was razed.

## FATAL BUGGY ACCIDENT AT MARBLE BAR - "DAD" Jerred Killed, Two Other Persons Injured

- September 6th 1912 -

A fatal buggy accident occurred yesterday afternoon. Messrs. Wright, Obermuller and Jerred were out driving, and had just left the Stray Shot mine. On coming down the hill towards the Moolyella road a trace broke, and

the horses got out of control, and left the road. Wright and Obermuller were thrown out on to the rocks. Wright picked himself up, and looked around, but could see no trace of Jerred, and was under the impression that he was amongst the spinifex. The horses cut across the rocks on to the Moolyella road and made for Marble Bar. Messrs. Gilmore and Hayes stopped the runaways at the entrance to the town, and found Jerred securely held by the end of his trousers to a hook on the swing bar. He had been dragged a mile and when released was unconscious, and died on the way to the hospital. One side of his face was completely torn away, both legs were broken, and ribs and arms fractured. He was frightly knocked about. Obermuller was stunned, is suffering from shock, and had abrasions on the back. Wright sustained a broken foot and severe shock.

"Dad" Jerred, who was 73 years of age, was highly respected, and the deepest sorrow is felt by the whole community at his terrible death. He is to be buried this afternoon. Wright and Obermuller are

**September 10,** At Coroner's inquest yesterday no fresh evidence was elicited, and a verdict of accidental death was returned.

## CYCLING ROUND AUSTRALIA

- September 26th 1939 -

**T**hin and sunburnt, with a slightly sprained wrist but otherwise in good condition, Douglas Hart, Australian cyclist, arrived at Marble Bar last night on his round-Australia cycle trip. He will leave tomorrow morning for Perth, via Roy Hill and Meekatharra.

Hart estimates that the trip to Perth will take 10 days. His wrist injury is not serious and was caused by a fall yesterday.

## TWO PILBARA NUGGETS

- September 26th 1904 -

**M**r Missingham has recommended the purchase, by the Government of the British Exploration Company's battery at Nullagine for erection as a State battery at the Twenty-Mile, Sandy.

The output of gold from the Nullagine district for August was 397.87 fine ounces from a little over 396 tons, and nearly 19 oz. of alluvial.

Two more big nuggets have been found in this district. One containing 90 oz of gold was

found recently about 30 miles from Sharks, on the Turner River. The same locality also furnished 22oz. Of small gold.

George Cooper, who has done 12 months of dead work at Talga, near Marble Bar, unearthed a specimen a few days ago weighing 255oz. The specimen is estimated to contain 100 oz of Gold.

## MARBLE BAR

- September 15th 1899 -

**M**r L Montagu, the manager of the diamond syndicate at Nullagine, passed through here today on his way to Perth. He reports having lately discovered three fair sized diamonds and five large garnets on the syndicate's holdings. The garnets which were exhibited, are brilliant ones.

## FIRST ANNUAL GOLF BALL

- September 29th 1938 -

**T**he golf club presented the first annual golf ball in the local hall on Friday evening, September 23. The evening was a huge success, being exceptionally well patronised. Dancing started at 8.30 p.m. and continued till 11.30 p.m. when a most delicious and enjoyable supper was served on the hall verandah. After supper dancing continued till 1.30 a.m. when Miss Leslie and Mr. Walters gave an exhibition of the Quick Step and the Viennese Waltz,

which was appreciated by all. Dancing once again continued till the finish at 3.30 a.m. Streamer and novelty dances helped pass away a most enjoyable evening. The catering for the supper was done by the proprietor of the Marble Bar Cafe. The organising of the ball was in the capable hands of Messrs. Harris and Reynolds, who are to be congratulated on their tireless and energetic work in presenting such a successful function. All present will be looking forward with renewed vigor for the annual! ball next year.






